Life is Precious Program

Mission Statement: Since LIP opened, our goal has been to provide activities that the teens and their families felt would be most helpful. Our community informed approach resulted in activities that include academic support, creative arts therapies, music, health/wellness activities and family services. We understood from the beginning that for the program to be a success it was necessary to break the barriers that stopped families from accessing mental health care.

LIP's motto "Survive, Thrive and Strive" exemplifies the program's goals. When a teen enters a LIP, she is met by a knowledgeable and empathetic staff of professional Latinas. Once there, she receives tutoring to improve her academic performance; takes part in creative arts therapy to work through their emotions using art, music, movement and poetry; increases her self-esteem by improving their sense of self-worth; and opens lines of communication with her family. Our teens are given the hope to imagine a future full of possibilities and the tools to achieve them.

About the Agency: Since 2008, Comunilife's Life is PreciousTM (LIP) program has provided suicide prevention activities to NYC Latina teens who have seriously considered or attempted suicide. The girls, who range in age from 12 to 17, are immigrants or first-generation Americans and live in some of New York City's lowest- income neighborhoods; LIP has four program locations - the Bronx (2008), Brooklyn (2009), Queens (2015) and Washington Heights (Manhattan) (2019). In FY 22, 181 Latina teens and their families accessed services. To be eligible for LIP the teens must be living with depression, suicide ideation or other diagnosed mental illness, be enrolled in school, under the care of a mental health clinician and have parents/guardians' permission.

Tuesdays and Thursday's we run STI (sexually transmitted infections) clinic. We run a pulmonary clinic. We treat patients with latent and active tuberculosis. On Monday's we plant TSTS (tuberculosis Skin Tests) and read them on Wednesday afternoon. We see patients & potential rabies exposure and provide rabies post exposure prophylaxis post hospitalization.

A Proud History of Community Service: 39 Years of Food, Clothing, and Caring

Founded in 1974, Dutchess Outreach has an established history of service to those in need. Our fiscal year ending June 30, 2013, was Dutchess Outreach's 39th year of serving Dutchess County residents who have little or no income and need help locating basic, life-sustaining resources.

Programs and Services:

Dutchess Outreach, Inc. provides emergency assistance through the following programming and services:

The Beverly Closs Memorial Food Pantry:

In the 12 months ending June 30, 2013, we provided 102,447 meals for 1,911 unique families: including 1,805 children. We can give a 3-day supply of groceries when identification for everyone in the household receiving food is provided. Everyone is eligible every 30 days.

The Lunch Box:

Our midday meal program served 81,589 free meals and our evening dinner program served 28,049 meals to the unemployed, the homeless, and those who do not earn a living wage. The Lunch Box also hosts programs on topics of importance to clients. We are located on the ground floor of the Family Partnership Center's eastern annex, just below the gymnasium.

The Emergency Fund:

The Emergency Fund is used to prevent evictions, restore utilities, purchase prescribed medication and/or supplies, and to transport people to alcohol and drug rehabilitation programs. Last year, we distributed \$24,720 in grants to purchase needed prescriptions for 241 people. With \$29,188 in grants and effective advocacy and referral we were able to prevent the eviction of 300 people, including 118 children. With \$16,937 in grants and our caseworkers' intervention we kept the lights or the heat on for another 537 people, of whom 249 were children. Eligibility is limited; our guidelines are available online at www.dutchessoutreach.org or at our Reception Center.

Staff provide crisis intervention, safety planning, advocacy, and accompaniment to survivors of all crime that have a connection to Dutchess County. Our center also offers trauma focused therapy services and case management services to all survivors. Advocates and case managers assist survivors with utilizing the Criminal Justice and Family Court systems, obtaining medical care, filing compensation claims, legal services referrals, relocation, obtaining benefits, finding shelter, and other emergency assistance needs to obtain and maintain safety. Mission Statement: To provide high quality, patient-centered primary health care in communities historically neglected due to racism and poverty, regardless of patients' ability to pay.

About Us: The Institute for Family Health is a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) and we operate community-based programs out of the FPC location. Those community-based programs include Dutchess County Healthy Families (DCHF) and the Perinatal and Infant Community Health Collaboratives (PICHC). Our free and voluntary home visiting services can provide support, information, knowledge, and resources to prenatal and parenting families in Dutchess County.

Programs and Services:

Dutchess County Healthy Families (DCHF):

Eligibility: Pregnant or parenting families with children under 3 months, adopting families Long-term program aimed to work with families until the child is 5 years old or entering school.

Healthy Families New York (HFNY) is an evidence-based, voluntary home visiting model designed to provide services to families that begin prenatally, or at birth, through age five. HFNY uses an infant mental health/relational development approach that promotes parent-child attachment to achieve its mission of preventing child abuse, neglect, and other adverse childhood outcomes.

The goals of the program are to:

- Support positive parent-child bonding and relationships.
- Promote optimal child and family health, development, and safety.
- Enhance family self-sufficiency.
- Prevent child abuse and neglect.

Perinatal and Infant Community Health Collaboratives (PICHC):

Eligibility: Prenatal individuals or parenting families with children under 2 years old. Short-term case management program aimed to connect individuals to community supportive services.

PICHC program helps prenatal individuals and families in achieving optimal health outcomes through connecting families to supportive services within their community. PICHC can assist participants with:

- Health insurance enrollment and recertification.
- Access to health care and finding medical providers.
- Assistance with applying for public assistance.
- Family Planning assistance and providing information about birth control options.
- Pregnancy and parenting support.
- Linkages to mental health/counseling, substance use treatment, and domestic violence services.
- Connection to emergency and supportive services (housing, food, clothing, employment, education, health, and safety.
